MEDICO-LEGAL EXPERIENCE

I have extensive experience of carrying out a range of psychiatric assessments and writing independent reports for a number of different courts, including civil and criminal court (and the First-tier Tribunal, Mental Health and the First-tier Tribunal, Immigration), since 2011.

I have authored around 1000 criminal and civil reports in my career; for the latter, at a ratio of around 45% for the Claimant, 35% for the Defendant and 20% as joint instructions. My current turn-over is around 3 reports per week (around 150 reports per year).

I dedicate most of my working week to undertaking medico-legal work. I am generally able to see clients and turn around reports very quickly.
